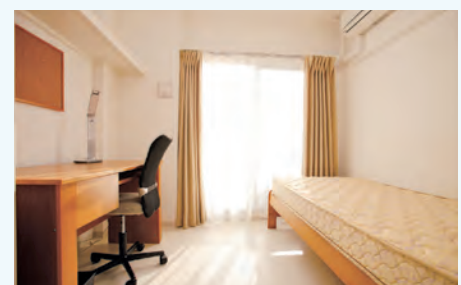


Accommodation at TUFS Campus
